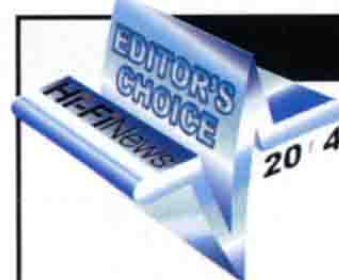




### Spendor S6e £1495



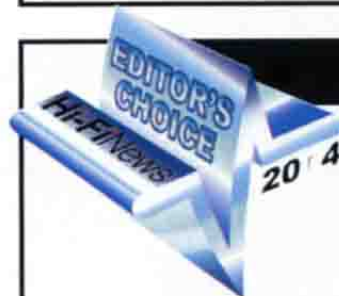
